External Verifier (EV) Activity 2018/2019

- No significant qualification issues reported for any visits except for concerns around the standardisation of approaches for the graded unit.
- This will be the focus of the workshop this afternoon.

CNO Widening Access Group Update

- Reviewing the case for all HNC student articulating to year 2 of the nursing degree programmes due to double funding issues and attrition rates.
- We are also looking at the funding for articulating students regarding the nursing bursary.

CNO Widening Access Group Update

- We are also reviewing the different articulation models.
- This is on-going work.



HNC Care and Administrative Practice

- We are removing the administrative side of the qualification.
- We will therefore need a new title for the qualification.
- Competition for this today to reflect the aim of the qualification with prizes.

HNC CAP and Pre-registration Standards

- No consensus as yet across Scotland about the broad content of each year of the new degree programme.
- Sheffield Halam is the only University to have already submitted their degree for validation with UHI and UWS submitting their programmes in the next month or so.

HNC CAP and Pre-registration Standards

- This has an impact on how far we can currently proceed with the HNC development plans.
- General topics for inclusion in year one.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

For inclusion in the new HNC:

- Mental Health and Resilience.
- Public Health and Health Promotion.
- Pharmacology.
- The four fields of nursing.
- Academic writing.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

- Combining Therapeutic Relationships and Sociology – reducing the number of theories examined and including an understanding of mental health issues.
- Removing the values, principles and communication outcome from Therapeutics.
- Removing the consumerism and financial aspect of sociology.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

- Individual Pathways in Health and Social Care – to remove most of the legislation and any references to administrative procedures.
- Include public health and health promotion – links to the integrated agenda, autonomy and self-determination in health.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

- Remove any references to administrative processes from Learning through Practice and Essential Skills.
- Review the calculations element and remove outdated calculations.
- Include an introduction to pharmacology.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

- Clinical Skills.
- These will not be affected by the new pre-registration standards but the Record of Achievement may have to change to reflect the changes to the university documentation.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

- To review Understanding Personal and Professional Development unit.
- To look at the current unit and amend any unnecessary content and activity.
- Include robust academic skills.
- Mental health, resilience and coping strategies for the student.

Proposals for the Revised HNC CAP

New Unit –

- to include an understanding of the four fields of nursing and allied professions and the challenges each faces.
- To move the values, principles, and communication outcome from Therapeutic Relationships to this unit.
- Could consider moving the abuse element from Principles of Professional Practice to this unit too.

Graded Unit –

- To be discussed at the workshops this afternoon.

To make this unit more robust we need to also consider:

- Amendment of the marking allocations.

Information on Workshop

- The information we give to students.
- The release of marks to students.

Aim

- To make this a robust independent submission
 - not just a checklist submission.



Articulation for 2020–2021

- The new degree programmes will start in September 2020.
- This may affect students moving from the current HNC to the new degree programme as some HEIs have suggested that year 1 and year 2 will start the new degree next September with year 3 students continuing with the current programme.

Articulation for 2020–2021

- This would mean that any articulating students, including current year 1 students would have to complete some additional learning to make up the difference – still under discussion.
