



About Fife College

- Annual Turnover: £48m (83% public funding)
- Campuses: Dunfermline, Glenrothes, Kirkcaldy, Levenmouth and Rosyth
- Full range of provision from learning support to degree level

ACTIONS GROUP

Chaired by Dawn Clark, Manager of Engagement & Employability.

Strategy Group which oversees and steers the college Corporate Parenting Plan and the strategies required.

Made up of Academic Heads, Managers etc with Student Representation in the form of the FCSA.

Clear focus and direction of the aims and the work required including fundraising requirements.

Decisions are then taken to the champions group where the operational requirements are taken forward.



CHAMPIONS GROUP

- Chaired by Dawn Clark, Manager of Engagement & Employability
- Made up of 40+ members of staff, rotating in responsibility and attendance
- This is a voluntary role for staff and sometimes involves evening or weekend activities
- Paul Sullivan (Care Review) recently attended the Champion Group to find out more about what we are doing – he was very impressed!



FUNDRAISING

- Ongoing fundraising throughout the academic year
- Christmas Raffle raised £500 and Principal Hugh Hall matched this to £1000
- Christmas gifts Principal Hugh Hall and FCSA raised funds so that every care experienced student received a £20 gift card at Christmas
- T- shirts!
- Currently in the process of arranging festive fundraising for 2019
- Each faculty has committed to a financial contribution to the festive fund
- Some staff took part in the Kilt Walk and also the Love Rally



Guidance Team

- Liaise with two named high schools each to meet Care Experienced students.
- Contact applicants as welcome, offering tours and funding application help.
- Help with UCAS and SAAS applications.
- Meet with our Care Experienced students throughout the year, some on a regular basis; others as needed. Refer to Who Cares? Scotland for advocacy support.
- Partner with other internal and external partners to provide more comprehensive support as corporate parents.



CARE EXPERIENCED

BURSARY

- Currently 185 students are currently in receipt of the Care Experienced bursary of £202.50 per week.
- College staff have also been supporting HE students to apply for the Care Experienced bursary through SAAS.
- We know that some students haven't formally disclosed their care identity and expect this to grow as they learn about the support and events that take place throughout the academic year
- If the age cap comes off in 2020, we anticipate that the support required will be beyond what anyone has considered!





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FCSA CARE EXPERIENCED OFFICERS

- The FCSA Care Experienced officers have been working hard to get more Care Experienced students involved.
- Carol was also invited to speak as a key note speaker at the Sparqs Conference regarding how to engage care experienced students. This led to a shared practice event with leading colleges and universities wishing to learn more about the Support that the FCSA and Fife College have in place support our Care Experienced students.
- To date there are 4 Care Experienced officers who are all dedicated to supporting our students. For next academic year we hope to double this.
- We were the first educational institution to introduce a Care Experienced Officer and are fundamental in developing the strategy within Fife College.



THE FIRST FCSA EVENT!

- First FCSA event was the Care Experienced Creative Writing contest called "Turning Point. This proved to be a very popular contest
- The prize was presented by Jenny Fagan, a care experienced author.

Fife College was delighted to host an exciting creative and moving engagement exhibition organised by the Children's Parliament recently to highlight the rights of children.

The College welcomed children from the Seen + Heard In Fife, a group of 12 children aged 11-13 who put on the exhibition using creative approaches to explore messages that they want to share with adults who can make a difference for children with care experience.


The work of the Children's Parliament is based on the UNICEF Rights of the Child and the youth theatre provision at Fife College has run for the past 18 years on the same philosophy which is to provide a safe environment for children to express themselves, develop their confidence and self –esteem and to feel that they have adult advocates to meet their basic needs. Our local council used to pay for the children to attend our youth theatre classes when it was run commercially but we have now been able to remove the financial barrier by maximising on our accreditation and educational awarding body powers to promote access for all children.

Our work continues in partnership and Fife College is proud to be a corporate parent.






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CE STUDENTS BY ACADEMIC AREA

Who Cares? Scotland Advocacy

- Fife College & Who Cares? Scotland joined together in 2018 to deliver a partnership approach to advocacy.
- **Fife College**
- Initially ½ day per week, however this increased to 2 ½ days per week
- This has proved to be really successful and has sparked discussions around more sustainable options for Fife College.





Who Cares? Scotland have completed 2 rounds of training throughout this year with various staff.

100% of attendees who completed their feedback questionnaire said that they would recommend this training to a colleague.

Feedback from staff was very positive.

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
Now our student President, Carol has been fundamental in raising awareness of Care Experienced in the College. She is an excellent role model, and won a Highly Commended award in the Student of the Year category at a national college awards ceremony organised by College Development Network (CDN).

Carol has won many awards, including the "outstanding contribution by college student award" from the Herald Higher Education awards. Carol has shared her own personal story through online blogs, Scottish Parliament and the Childrens Hearing Scotland Civic reception, where she is now a newly appointed member of the Children's Panel.


- Openly shares care identity with students

COLLABORATIVE WORKING AND SUCCESS

Staff from Guidance, Inclusion and Faculty worked together as a team to support a student throughout his journey from starting NC Level 5 Acting and Performance and who is working towards completing his HND this year.

Alongside Who Cares? Scotland, College Staff supported him through recent difficulties with housing and social work which could have impacted negatively not just on his life but on his academic achievement and future.

This inspirational student secured temporary summer employment within the college, which he couldn't have been more proud of!





SUPPORT IN ACTION

A care experienced student who had newly moved into independent living become unwell and was admitted to hospital. The student reached out to one of the corporate parenting group expressing how terrified she was to be alone and in hospital.

The member of staff brought essential personal items and clothing to the young person and then visited her daily, checking in with hospital staff for updates on progress. When the young person was well enough to go home, the member of staff took her home.

The young person made a full recovery and was very vocal about her appreciation for everything that we did for her.

The young person is now back at college and also working part time, as well as being a Care Experienced Officer and Class Rep.

- We held our first scholarship for students who are Care Experienced or Young Carers.
- The Independent Living scholarship allowed students to apply for up to £500.
- 3 Care Experienced students were successful in their applications and were awarded these scholarships.
