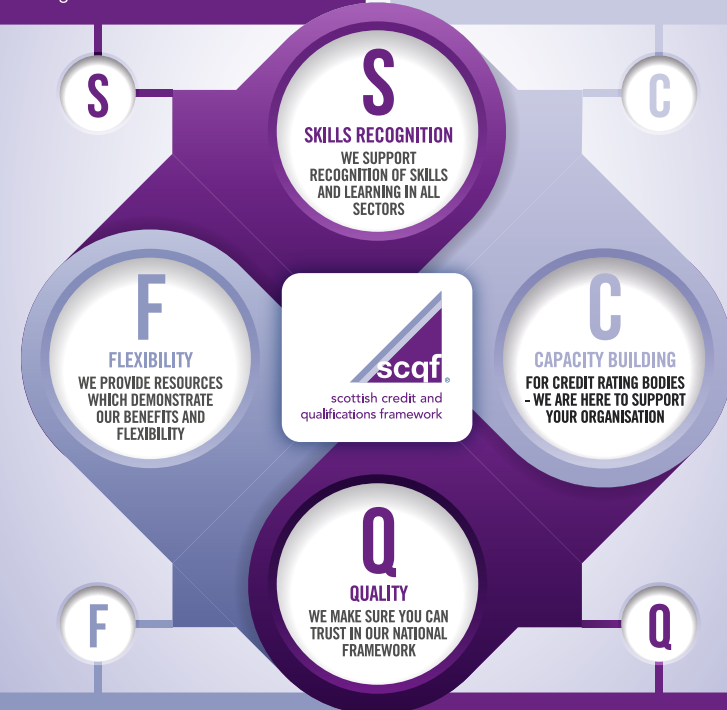

Jim Metcalfe

Chief Executive, College Development Network (CDN)

Jim Metcalfe is Chief Executive of CDN, a Trustee of the UK Energy Saving Trust, a Director of the SCQF Partnership, and Scotland Skills Ambassador for the Institute of Directors Scotland. He serves on the Scottish Government's Curriculum Advisory Board, and chairs the Scottish Colleges' Climate Emergency Group.

Previously Head of Development and Practice at the Carnegie UK Trust, his work there focused on entrepreneurship and skills, local economic development, and supporting leadership networks across sectors. He has worked extensively with colleges and further education institutions across the UK and Ireland, particularly through the Enterprising Minds and TestTown initiatives. Jim joined Carnegie as Senior Policy Officer focusing on economics and wellbeing, and has published a range of socioeconomic research papers for the Trust.

Prior to joining Carnegie UK, Jim worked as a director with the charity Age Concern England, as a researcher for two members of parliament and serving Government ministers, and from 2012 to 2014 was an adviser to the European Commission on entrepreneurship education.

Danielle joined Dundee Rep's Graduate Actor Scheme, a programme that helps graduates make the transition from drama school into the industry.

She is now a professional actor based in Glasgow.

Danielle was a nominee for the One To Watch Category in the Herald Scottish Culture Awards 2019, and was recently nominated in the UK Pantomime Awards 2022 for Best Principal Girl for my performance in Beauty and the Beast at HMT Aberdeen.

Kayleigh Haggo is a graduate of Ayrshire College, where she gained her HNC Coaching and Developing Sport. She won three gold medals at the European Paralympic Youth Games, setting 13 world records and four national age group records in swimming, race running and club throw sports, is testament to her phenomenal drive, determination and commitment to succeed, irrespective of any barriers that are placed in front of her.

Kayleigh has also been recognised by the NUS in their 'Inspire her Future' initiative, which is a priority campaign for NUS Scotland Women's Committee, working to inspire and empower women students in areas where they are under-represented.

She has been further recognised by various organisations with awards including: Ayrshire Sportsability – Young Athlete of the Year; The Herald Higher Education Awards – Outstanding Contribution from a Student – Finalist; YoungScot Unsung Hero – Finalist; Finalist for the College Candidate of the Year Award at the SQA Star Awards 2017; Winner of Rising Star Diversity Award at The Herald and GenAnalytics Diversity Awards 2017 and Winner of Vocational Award at the British Education Awards 2018.



These achievements earned Kayleigh a place in the YWCA's prestigious '30 under 30' list for 2017, highlighting the achievements of young women in Scotland who are doing significant work across the country.

Kayleigh has used these experiences to coach and inspire young people throughout Scotland. A fantastic ambassador of Ayrshire College, Kayleigh is an Active Schools Coordinator and a Scottish Disability Sport tutor. She is also an Ambassador for Ayrshire Sportsability and Aofie's Sensory Bus which involves touring around Ayrshire schools, businesses and other organisations to talk about the benefits of participation in sport for people with disabilities.

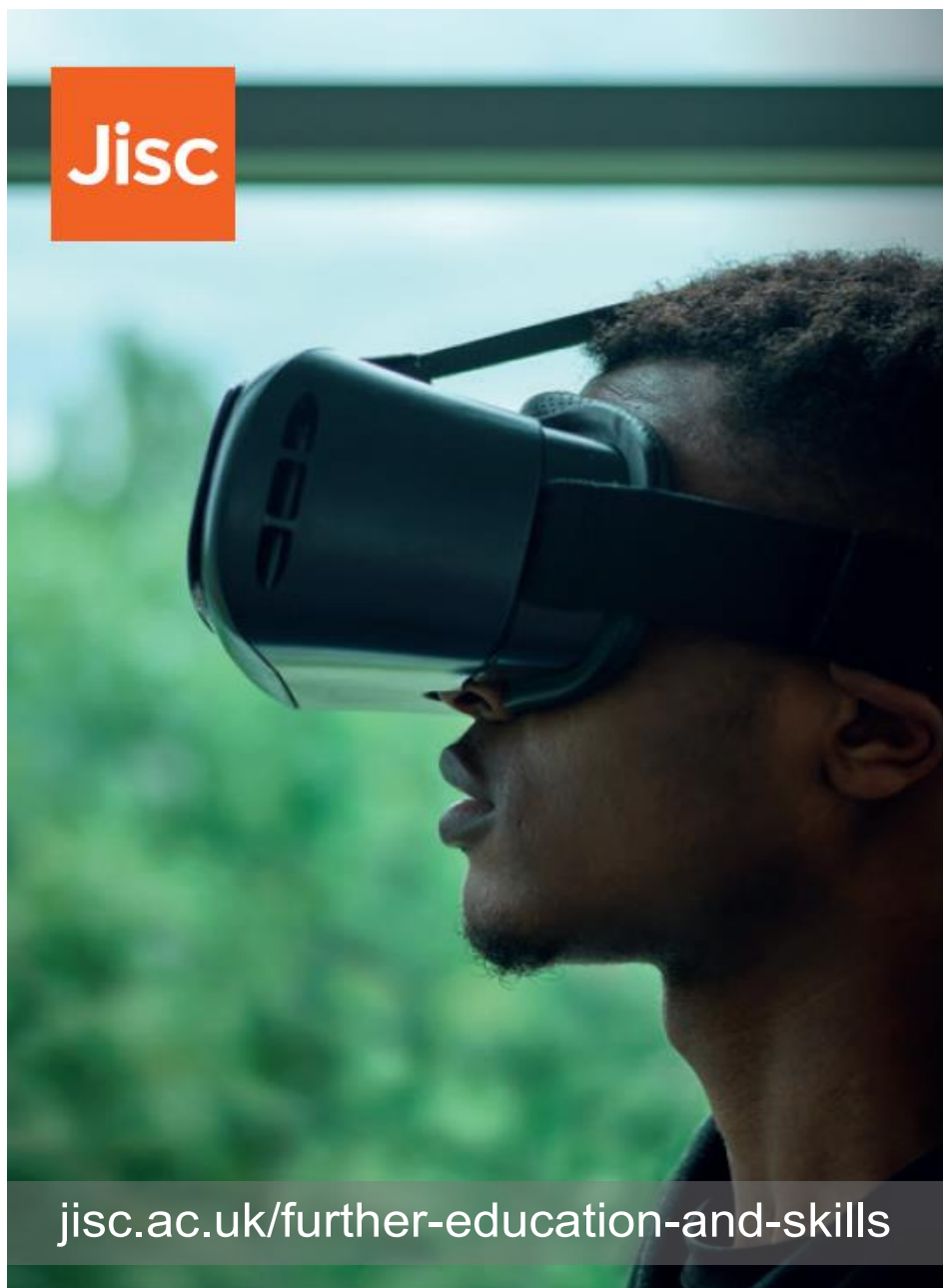
