WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO

CDN is the national improvement agency for the Scottish college and post-school skills sector. We work with colleges to develop their people, share their great work, and enhance student success. An influential convening power, we facilitate collaboration within the college sector.

CDN improves the institutional performance and workforce capability of Scotland's colleges and their people through practice-led professional learning pathways. This is supported by evidence-based collaborative enhancement programmes and professional networks.

CDN is the leading expert on college governance in Scotland and runs the National Board Development Programme for College Boards. Through our leadership programmes for college staff at all levels, we develop college leaders of the future.

CDN works with colleges to provide research and insight to improve sector-wide practice. Through our learning and teaching programmes, CDN provides support for the design and delivery of the curriculum of the future.

Over the next three years, our work will be structured around the delivery of the following core practice-led professional learning pathways:

- Governance (The National College Board Development Programme)
- **Leadership** (Developing the College Leaders of the Future)
- Learning and Teaching (Designing and Delivering the Curriculum of the Future)
- Learner Support (Service Delivery for Successful Learners)
- Reflective Practice (The College Researcher Development Programme).

Our approach to delivery

Each pathway will have its own set of evidence-based provision, and to deliver them we will use a range of activities and interventions. This will include a mix of the following:

Core Programme: Learning materials, workshops and network facilitation to support continuing professional development.

Accredited Training: Courses leading to a recognised award in an area of professional development.

Bespoke Training: Tailored sessions for teams in a specific area of practice in support of college staff development plans.

Expo Events: Practice-sharing conferences and seminars both online and in-person to propagate innovative approaches.

Step Forward: Bespoke consultancy to assist with developing solutions to practical challenges in service and curriculum delivery.

Insight: Practice-based action research projects that examine or highlight college practice to support the creation of evidence-based improvement activities. Research outputs will inform and underpin the development and delivery of CDN's suite of professional learning pathways. Outputs will also be disseminated in partnership with colleges and via blogs, podcasts, articles, case studies and events.
